

We also completed renovation of our Soteria at Work woodshop in January of 2022. Its sad to say, but on July 13th our shop was destroyed by fire. This was a devastating blow to the men we train and to our community. This shop was an asset to our program. We are still in the process of rebuilding and hope to purchase a building soon in the West Village of Greenville. Thank you all for your support and prayers.

Soteria CDC provides previously incarcerated individuals with wraparound services for 6 - 12 months, including housing, education, employment, affirmation, & advocacy to empower smooth transitions back into society.

2022 significantly impacted Soteria CDC with both blessings and challenges. On July 13, our Soteria at Work woodshop, where we use woodworking to teach job skills to men enrolled in our program, caught fire and burned everything. We have been fundraising to

replace our workshop, and we look forward to opening our new shop in 2023.

Just after the fire, we celebrated the work and future of Soteria by opening a new 16-bed Soteria House for Women where we now extend Soteria's services to women who would otherwise be homeless after incarceration.




Soteria CDC advocates for economic & social justice for those & their families impacted by the criminal justice system.

## HOUSING



### **SOTERIA HOUSE**

Soteria House for Men and Soteria House for Women each provide a home for up to 16 individuals. The first 30 days in our program is free of charge while we take interns to doctor appointments, probation and parole meetings, and the DMV to obtain ID's. This is also when we develop short and long term goals. Based on those goals, we offer job placement for employment which begins after those first 30 days of getting settled and focused. Once employed, interns contribute to the cost of housing, food, and transportation in the form of Program Fees.

Soteria House for Women opened in the summer of 2022, and grew to 7 residents by December. We expect to meet full capacity in 2023.

### AFFORDABLE HOUSING

To further our commitment to community development, Soteria provides affordable housing units for low-moderate income families. We have (6) 2-Bedroom and (8) 3-Bedroom residences for rent, currently giving homes to 38 individuals, of which 17 are children.

### **FUTURE PLANS:**

A generous friend of Soteria donated four 2 bedroom, 1 bath homes in need of renovations to our organization that we will call "Soteria Second Chance Housing".

Our Soteria at Work crew will renovate the homes over the Spring and Summer of 2023 so that we can offer an additional 4 homes to Soteria graduates and their families by the end of the year.

# EDUCATION

### EDUCATIONAL EMPOWERMENT

Soteria CDC surrounds individuals with the necessary resources to build a foundation for success, and education is a critical component of that foundation.

We require 102 hours of weekly **finanical literacy classes** to graduate our 12 month Reentry
Program. During that time, we help interns improve their credit scores and also offer a 2 to 1 savings matching program that can be used on a vehicle, higer education, small business, or a home.

**Relapse Prevention Classes** help men and women struggling with addiction so that they do not fall back into destructive cycles of behavior.

We also help interns reach **educational goals** from literacy to GEDs to degrees from higher education. In 2022, we helped individuals learn to read and write, to pursue certification in driving fork lifts, to graduate culinary school at Greenville Tech, to work toward obtaining a CDL as well as certifications in Cosmetology.

# **EMPLOYMENT**

### SKILL BUILDING

Soteria CDC empowers men and women with criminal backgrounds to take control of their futures. Once time has been served, a crime should not prevent individuals from going after the careers of their choice.

To show the importance of job skills and to help our interns succeed in their jobs, we employ men during their first 30 days at our Social Enterprise, Soteria At Work, where we teach deconstruction and woodworking skills. After their first 30 days are complete, if they would like to pursue a career in woodworking, we will hire them onto the Soteria At Work staff where they will both build furniture and teach new interns job skills.

### JOB PLACEMENT

For men and women who are not interested in working with our social enterprise beyond their first 30 days, Soteria connects interns with jobs in the community that align with their long term goals. Our network of employers either already have a policy in place to give second chances to men and women or they work closely with Soteria to start giving second chances. If you are interested in employing men and women working to thrive after incarceration, give us a call.

### THE FIRE

On July 13, 2022, a fire started in the dumpster just outside of our Soteria at Work loading dock. It spread to our wooden rollup door and then reached the spray insulation which accelerated the flames. We lost everything. Since then, we have been looking to rebuild a workshop space so that we can continue teaching woodworking skills to help men thrive after incarceration.

# **AFFIRMATION**

### **POWER OF POSITIVITY**

We match each of our interns with a **mentor** to guide and coach them through the challenges of reentry.

Our weekly **Bible Studies** and **Daily Devotions** supported by **journaling** requirements teach our interns to process their lives and their futures on spiritual and emotional levels. The belief in a higher power that frees prisoners, feeds the hungry, and loves unconditionally creates hope, opportunity, and motivation to live into the life that Christ places before us.

25% of individuals with convictions in SC are eligible for expungement

Soteria helped individuals seeking expungement for 116 charges in 2022. Of those, 15 charges were expunged.
